# WHAT TO DO WHEN...

<b>PROBLEM/NEED</b>	<b>SOLUTION</b>
<b>Absence</b>	Have parent call school the day you are out (729-3094 or 3095).
<b>Arriving late or leaving early</b>	Sign in at attendance. Parents <i>must</i> call. Freshmen may not leave the building without signing out.
<b>Miss the bus</b>	Get a ride from a parent or neighbor, walk, call a taxi, but <b>COME TO SCHOOL</b> . <i>Sign in at attendance.</i>
<b>Appointment during school hours</b>	Have a parent call in and excuse you <i>ahead of time</i> . Go to Attendance to sign out when you leave school.
<b>Illness/injury</b>	Ask your classroom teacher for a pass to the nurse.
<b>Permission to IMC</b>	Ask the teacher whose assignment you're working on for a pass to leave study hall. Check in with study hall teacher.
<b>Need tutoring/help</b>	See teacher, counselor, or go to department resource room. For private tutoring (to be paid for by parent), see Instructional Supervisor.
<b>Problem with teacher</b>	Discuss problem after school when you can meet privately with the teacher. If you feel you can't approach the teacher by yourself, see your counselor for help/suggestions.
<b>Scheduling problem/ drop or add a class</b>	See your counselor during lunch, homeroom, study hall, or a free mod.

# WHAT TO DO WHEN...

<b>PROBLEM/NEED</b>	<b>SOLUTION</b>
<b>Want to join a club, team, or activity</b>	See sponsor of club (list of clubs and sponsors in this guide) or go to Student Activities Office.
<b>To attend dance, activity</b>	Buy ticket in Student Activities Office. Bring your ID card with you to event.
<b>Need a notebook, etc.</b>	Go to school bookstore.
<b>Lost articles/books</b>	Go to Lost and Found in the bookstore.
<b>Lost valuables</b>	Go to the Attendance Office.
<b>Lost ID card</b>	Go to Attendance Office and purchase a new one.
<b>Problem with locker</b>	Report problem in Attendance Office.
<b>Hungry</b>	Breakfast is available from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM in the East Cafeteria. Cost is \$1.75. During lunch mods you can choose a variety of items from full hot lunch to a salad, sandwich, soup, fresh fruit, yogurt, or add to the lunch you brought from home.
<b>Problem with other students and/or threats, harassment</b>	See the Dean of Students.
<b>Problems with parents, stress, anxiety, etc.</b>	See your counselor.

## WHAT IF I'M SICK?

In case you are ill or there is a severe family illness, parents are expected to telephone the Attendance Office on the day of the absence. The direct line numbers to the Attendance Office are 729-3094 or 3095. Notes from parents or calls from friends will not be accepted.

The following are the reasons a student will be granted an "excused" absence:

1. Personal illness, severe illness or death in the family
2. Medical appointments
3. Court appearances
4. Religious holidays

Requests for excused absences for medical appointments, court appearances, religious holidays, or family vacations should be made in advance by a telephone call to the Attendance Office.

Students will be given an "**unexcused**" absence for all other reasons such as:

1. Oversleeping
2. Missing the bus
3. Running out of gas
4. Talking to a friend about a problem
5. Flat tire

### **In-School Illness:**

Except for an emergency, ask your classroom teacher for a pass to the Nurse's Office. The Nurse's Office is located in Room 131. (Near the Old Pit.)



## WHEN ARE GRADES GIVEN?

First Quarter ends Friday, October 29, 1993  
First Semester ends Thursday, January 20, 1994  
Third Quarter ends Friday, March 25, 1994  
Second Semester ends Thursday, June 9, 1994

## HOW DO GRADES WORK?

Semester grades assigned to students are computed by using the following factors: 1) first quarter grade, 2) second quarter grade, and 3) final semester evaluation grade. These grades are expressed as a percentage score and converted to a letter grade using the following guidelines:

A	=	90 - 100%
B	=	80 - 89%
C	=	70 - 79%
D	=	60 - 69%
F	=	Below - 60%

The final semester grade will be computed using the equation:

$$\begin{array}{l} 2/5 (.40) \text{ of the first quarter grade} \\ 2/5 (.40) \text{ of the second quarter grade} \\ +1/5 (.20) \text{ of the final evaluation grade} \\ \hline \text{Final semester grade} \end{array}$$

**Important Note:** Only the final semester grade is written down on a student's permanent record.

## WHO QUALIFIES FOR HONOR ROLL?

At the conclusion of each semester, students will be selected for the honor roll if they earn at least a 3.3 all-subject grade point average (GPA) where:

A	=	4 points
B	=	3 points
C	=	2 points

## WHO IS MY COUNSELOR?

As you enter high school, each of you is assigned a personal counselor. Most of you are placed with a counselor based on the first letter of your last name.

Your counselor is the one person at Glenbrook South who normally works with you during the entire time you are in high school. Teachers, coaches, even club sponsors change from time to time, but as much as possible we try to keep you with the same counselor for all four years.

What do you do with a counselor now that you have one? Each of you will see your counselor to accomplish tasks that are required by the school such as receiving orientation information, registering for classes, planning your high school curriculum, getting college and career information, and taking special tests.

Listed on the next page are some other reasons that students often come in to see their counselors. Keep in mind that your counselor is here to help you be the best student that you can possibly be. No one can think very clearly about a math equation or remember a foreign language if there is a big problem bothering him/her. Counselors are trained to help students deal with many problems that can arise during high school. You may have a quick question or a long story to tell. Either way, your counselor is here to listen and to help you find answers to your questions.

**Remember:** Your counselor will get to know you faster if you will just stop by and say "hi" now and then. We are located in the front of the building.



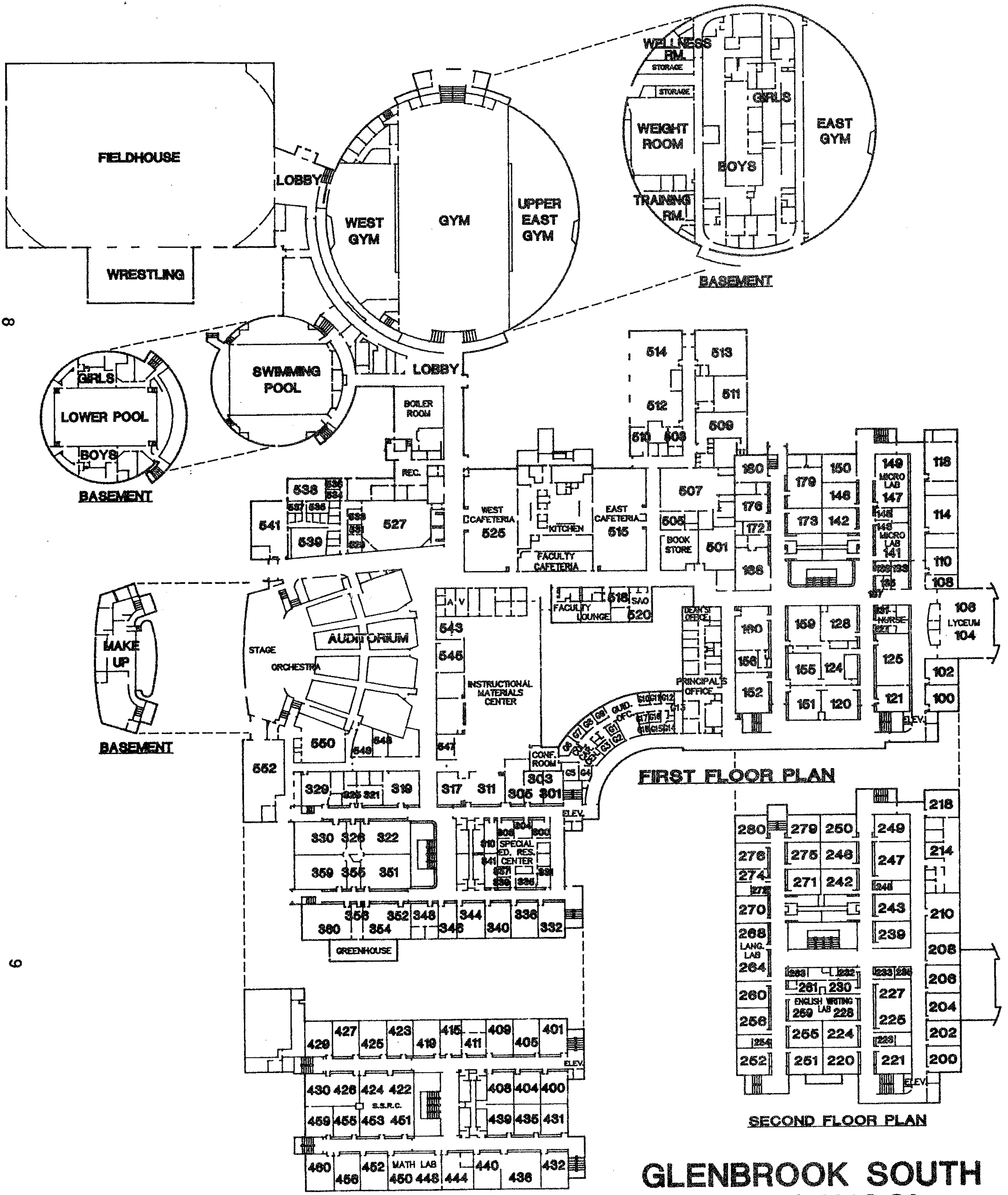
## **SOME POSSIBLE REASONS TO SEE YOUR COUNSELOR**

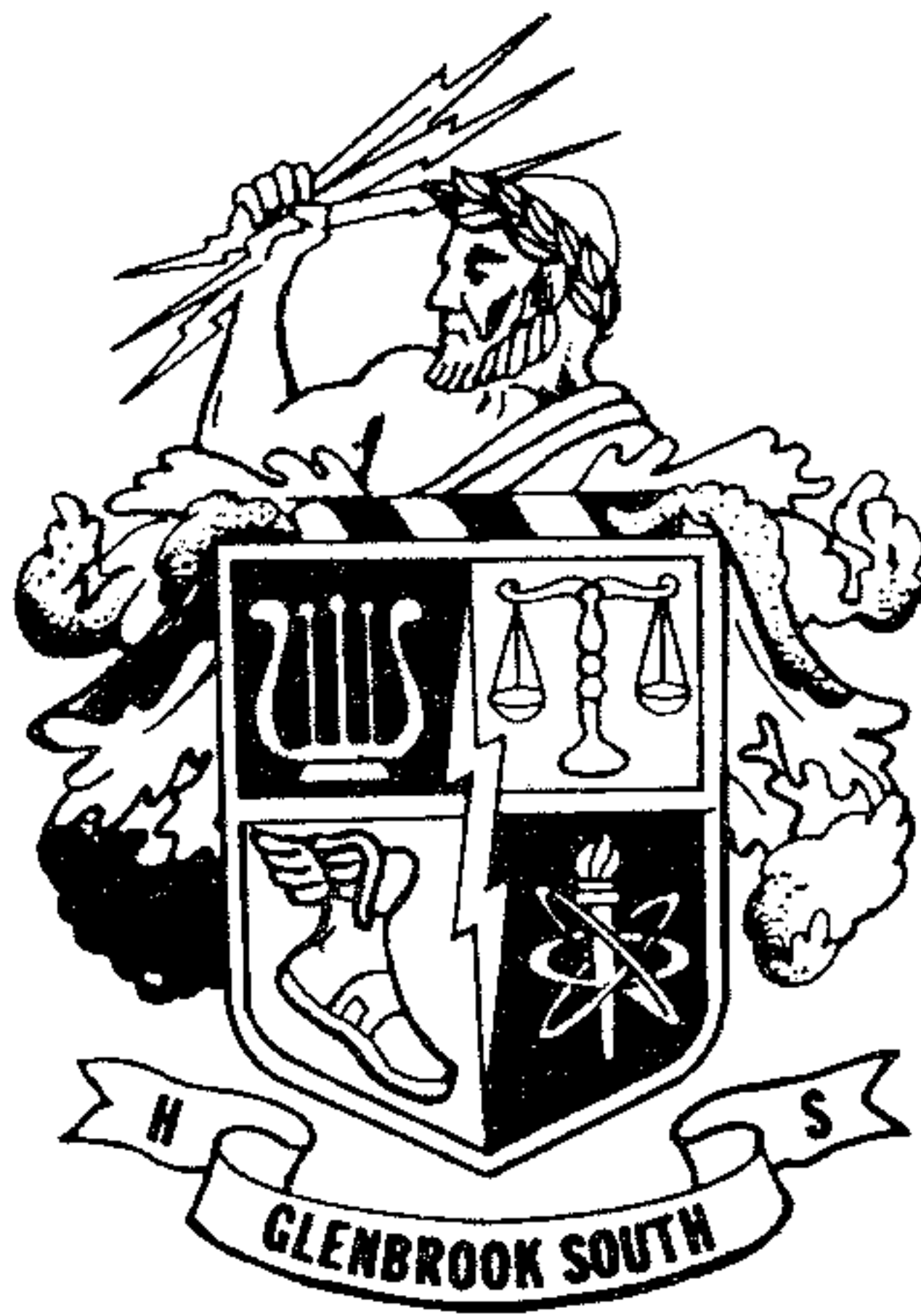
